Monochrome art presents the viewer with one predominant color mood, aura, or statement. It can be a "true" monochrome dependent on a single steady tone or on subtle tonal variation. Will your creation be in black and white? Will it be in varying tones of ONLY one color? We are excited to see your entry!

EXHIBIT WINNERS



ABSTRACT was the subject for November's Exhibit. This show was judged by inspirational expressionist healing artist, Dorothy Fagan. Fagan is known for transforming trauma into strokes of color while on her inspirational healing journeys through art. She developed her unique ColorME energized palette during residences in France and Italy. She also fulfills the healing mission of her artistry through poetry, live interactive painting demonstrations of the healing creative process, and through private consultations.

Fagan commented that an opportunity to experience the world through color, texture, space and form awaits the viewers in the prize-winning artist's paintings at the RAL Art Center's Abstract Show.

Peering through lush translucent veils of magenta, green, and lavender, one discovers nuances of yellow painted by Michael Stevens in his FIRST PLACE show-stopping work called "#23." Fagan explained that this five foot painting feels confident, yet exploratory. Stevens treats us to a portal of the world within by inviting the viewer to dive deep within to find themselves in a warp and weft of ebb and flow.

A diptych by Laura Edwards took SECOND PLACE engaging us in "Conversation" (name of artwork) with back and forth bold strokes, strong contrasts, and crisp lines. Fagan said we feel the urge to dance with her up tempo orchestration of lights, blues, and earth tones. A small pastel by Mel Neale called "Golden Hour" received a THIRD PLACE begging to be larger than the confines of its frame. Expressive bold color and energetic calligraphy makes the viewer feel magically alive and vibrant. Honorable Mentions were awarded to Sammy Anderson for "Window View", Kathryn Murray for "No Absolutes", Sue Ramsey for "Hello Moon", and Lella Lee Edwards for "Fish."

RAL ART CENTER GALLERY WINDOW ARTISTS

"Winter and the Holidays" is the theme of December's RAL Art Center Gallery Windows. Featuring talented artists, Cheryl Mihills and Sue Ramsey, their beautiful work is certain to bring you joy this holiday season.

Gallery Window Artist ~ Cheryl Mihills

Cheryl Mihills creates mini-masterpieces with her punch needle designs. This ancient craft dates back to the 15th century and was used in medieval Europe primarily for decorating



religious vestments, but was also used for adorning traditional folk costumes. On a larger scale it was used to make wool-punched rugs which resemble hooked rugs.

Cheryl has explored many creative art media since majoring in art and design at the Rochester Institute of Technology, but has focused on the punch needle fiber medium since discovering the technique over 40 years ago. Cheryl begins each new needlework with an idea and sometimes a sketch, and the artwork evolves as she continues to punch. It is like drawing and painting with the punch needle. Each original work is created with one strand of thread and a punch needle, using tiny loops and stitches on a fabric background. The punch needle pieces you will see in the Gallery

windows are about 3" x 3" and framed in a hand-painted, custom made frames. It takes many hours to complete just one square inch of these exquisite mini-masterpieces! Even so, Cheryl remains committed to this medium and is inspired to create new images and use new techniques. Her talent has earned her many awards as well as recognition as one of the top traditional craftsmen in the country by *Early American Life* magazine. Be sure to stop by and get up close to admire the artistry shown in each of these Christmas-themed gems.

Gallery Window Artist ~ Sue Ramsey

Artist Sue Ramsey is talented in many mediums from watercolors to acrylic, to cold wax and oil, as well as fiber arts – including knitting and felting. While majoring in elementary education in college she also studied art and experimented with various art and craft media. After ten years of teaching in the Richmond area, she opened a gift and accessory shop which she owned and managed for twenty years. Sue is now retired and lives in Sharps, on the banks of the Rappahannock River.

With an interest in photography and love of travel, when Sue began taking watercolor lessons she often painted the flowers of her garden and landscapes she'd photographed during her many trips. Those photos became much of her source material for her paintings. Sue has made many of her paintings into greeting and Christmas cards which are sold in the RAL Gallery and in shops in North Carolina. Come see some of Sue's variety of artistry in the Gallery Windows as she displays some wintry scenes done both in watercolor and the cold wax and oil technique.





Barbara Brecher is an award-winning fiber artist who has worked to develop a unique felting process that involves innovative dying and painting techniques. Her creative and wearable designs combine both silk and wool, displaying a lively range of vivid color and texture. Her creations include shawls and scarves, jackets, skirts, clutch purses, and even a stunning bride's dress that she exhibited in our recent Labor Day Art Show.

Laura Edwards has recently relocated to Irvington from Alexandria, VA, where for over 25 years she maintained a working artist studio at the Torpedo Factory Art Center. Her abstract oil paintings are intuitive, having no concrete reference, but often evoke a familiar image. Her wet on wet technique produces images that are seamless fields of color. Laura's diptych "Conversation" took second place in the Art Center's November Abstract Show.

RAL Art Center Classes - 2021 Update



Since reopening in June, the RAL Art Center continues to focus on ensuring that class attendees, instructors and volunteers can appreciate the newly remodeled Pike Studio in a safe, respectful, and welcoming environment. It is encouraging to see the positive response to the implementation of best practices health cleaning guidelines, wearing face coverings, and practicing physical distancing to keep our community safe.

While the uncertainty of the pandemic has impacted potential instructors and students, Doug Mock has continued his watercolor series for previous students and the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts (VMFA) has provided instructors for four successful classes. 
