#### The May RAL Gallery Windows

The RAL Art Center Gallery windows will feature two very talented and diverse artists for the month of May. **Mel Neale** is a prolific artist who works in a variety of media including watercolor and pastels. The pieces she has displayed in the windows this month are done in soft pastels, although with their bold strokes of color you could mistake them for paintings. Her style incorporates realistic details but can also have a delightful impressionistic feeling as well. Mel's painting titled **"Blue Plated Persimmon"** is eye–catching with its bright colors and unusual perspective looking down at a plate of beautiful orange persimmons. Her other pieces on display in the windows are also Still Life paintings to go along with the theme of the May Member's show inside the Gallery.

**Sarah Soderlund**, our 2nd featured artist for May, works in acrylics and collage and is an abstract artist. Her paintings are inspired more by 'feeling' than by subject. Sarah first began painting much more realistic subject matter in watercolors but then was drawn towards the greater freedom of expression that an abstract work offers. Abstract painting requires the skillful use of color and line to create an interesting and compelling composition. The title of one of Sarah's displayed paintings is **"Just Wondering"**, which leads the viewer to consider what that painting means to them. Stop by the Gallery Windows and discover what feeling *you* see in her paintings, something that may be uniquely yours!

The May RAL Art Center Windows offer a wonderful contrast between the works of two very different, very creative artists.



In this class, students will make silk paper using silk and wool. This is a simple process, much like felting, but without the rubbing and rolling! The easy step-by-step instructions enables anyone to make a beautiful piece of

paper. All materials will be available at the workshop. Feel free to bring thread, leaves or other light flat materials to incorporate in your paper.

During the two-hour class, students will make two pieces of paper and mold a small bowl. This is a simple but messy process, so please dress appropriately. The work will remain wet when you take it home, so bring a couple of large plastic bags to keep your paper safe and your car
